

CAMP SPRINGS INITIATIVE
April 14, 2008
MINUTES

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the Camp Springs Initiative was held April 14, 2008 at St. John Lutheran. Attending were Carolyn Allender, Lonnie Enzweiler, Nancy Enzweiler, Phillip Garber, Lauri Harding, Chuck Heilman, Cory Wagner, Don Wiedeman and Anna Zinkhon.

The meeting began with a welcome from Carolyn Allender, President. Minutes of the last meeting (November 2007) were read and accepted with one change.

The Treasurer's report was given with a new balance of \$503.71. A motion was made by Anna Zinkhon and seconded by Cory Wagner to accept the treasurer's report. The motion carried.

Committee Reports

A list of charges for the committees was distributed and comments solicited.

Camp Springs Day: Cory will set the date for Camp Springs Day

Watershed Protection and Stream Quality Improvement: Cory will contact Don Girton

Trails:

- Bill 196, which was concerned with liability issues, passed.
- The committee plans to examine how we can work with the county on the trail project
- Discussions with Dallas Bray about the trailhead are continuing.
- The Bridle Trail representatives will begin contacting property owners and display a draft of the trail at the next meeting.
- Anna brought up the possibility of cooperation with the Horse Network, which would include a county-wide tag system,
- There is a need to contact LaFarge about possible funding for the project.
- Chuck reported on the meeting with representatives from Indian Hill and expressed reservations about the multi-use nature of the trail. The idea is to keep the walking trail in front of the houses. A loop including Upper Tug Fork, Lower Tug Fork and Four Mile was proposed.
- Discussion of allowing casual bike riding on the walking trail was held.

- Plans for the walking trail need to be discussed with regard to plans to widen Four Mile.
- A proposal was made to send a note to all affected property owners and present the trail idea at the Memorial Day Picnic with a more formal presentation later.

Historic Homes:

The landscaping for the sign at the AA Highway is long overdue.

Public Education and Outreach:

The idea of a newsletter was enthusiastically received. The Extension Office will be contacted. They may be able to help with layout and distribution of the newsletter.

Preservation of Agricultural Heritage:

On the second Tuesday in May, there will be a public hearing on the Comprehensive Plan. Materials are available on-line. Camp Springs is listed as Mixed Rural Use.

The next meeting will be held on May 12 at 7 p.m. at St. John Lutheran
