Sewer Line Update

A ruling in Campbell County Circuit Court by Julie Reinhart Ward in October granted SD1 the right to eminent domain for the force-main sewer project. An appeal has been filed by each property owner. A second law suit, filed by Preserve and Protect Camp Springs, related to the lack of proper environmental processes is pending in Franklin County Circuit Court. As of press time, bids on the sewer line project have not been sent out.

The first fund raiser for Preserve and Protect netted over \$6,000. Another fund raiser is planned. *In addition, donations can be made at Citizen's Bank, or by check, made out to Preserve and Protect Camp Springs and mailed to Anna Zinkhon at 5210 Owl Creek Road, Camp Springs, KY 41059.*
