Junk Drawer Fabrics Opens on Ten Mile Road

In August 2018, Linda (Enzweiler) Reller's dream of opening a fabric store became a reality. Junk Drawer Fabrics, located in her home at 2646 Ten Mile Road has been attracting customers from Camp Springs to Dayton, OH since then. As a child, Linda watched her Grandmother, Balbina (Ritter) Enzweiler, sew and piece quilts. She was fascinated and has been an able sewer for her whole life. In her retirement, she has decided to help others have access to good quality fabrics at reasonable prices in her shop. She sells fabric from the bolt and pre-cut fabric for quilters, in addition to thread, handmade ornaments, jewelry and children's craft kits. Her shop is attractively decorated with old sewing machines, including the one her grandmother used, and pictures of Balbina and her sisters.

Linda hopes that her shop will be a place where sewers and quilters will feel comfortable and use as a place to gather. In the future, she is looking forward to offering classes in her space. She also hopes to attract young sewers through her competitive pricing.

Where Is Four Mile, Kentucky?

In 1871, when a post office opened in our area, it would have had the name Four Mile P.O., except that there was already a Four Mile, Kentucky. The post office here opened as Camp Springs P.O. and remained active till 1907, when it was moved to Melbourne, where the mail was dropped off by train.

The other Four Mile, Kentucky, is in Bell County, northwest of Pineville, and has the zip code of 40939.

Knit/Crochet Together: A New Ministry at St. John Lutheran

St. John Lutheran offers both experienced knitters and crocheters as well as people who want to learn the skills the chance to gather, learn and create warm items which will be donated to the Mid-Kentucky Community Action Partnership in Beattyville, Kentucky and to other local charities. Materials for the group have been donated or provided by Modern Lutheran Women of St. John Lutheran. An intergenerational team teaches the skills: Haven Enzweiler, Nancy Enzweiler and Belle Lang.

The group is open to knitters, crocheters and anyone middle-school age and up who would like to learn to knit or crochet. Initial supplies are provided.
