Camp Springs News Celebrates 50 Issues

In the summer of 2008, CSI (Camp Springs Initiative) discussed publishing a newsletter for the community. Don Wiedemann and I (Nancy Enzweiler) volunteered to work on the project. Because of prior commitments, I was unable to help with the initial issue, which came out in August 2008. Don's computer skills were limited, so the masthead was literally cut and pasted in place. From the beginning, the major points of distribution have been the four area churches. After the initial issue, which included articles about CSI, Camp Springs Day, and the 2nd Annual Herbst Tour, I took over the layout together with my son, Peter. He created the masthead we use today (illustration by Keith Neltner) and still helps me with formatting problems, when they arise. The publication took on a quarterly publication schedule, which it retains to this day. The goal has always been to have the *Camp Springs News* published for distribution by the first Sunday of March, June, September and December. Over the years, the *Camp Spring News* has included articles on local farms, wineries and businesses in addition to CSI and Preserve and Protect updates. There have been "Meet Your Neighbor" columns and articles about the artistic endeavors of local residents. For years, much of the publication was engaged with the highly successful Herbst Tour. In March 2018, we even published a Dining Issue and in another issue we featured a poem by Susie (Futscher) Bradley. Many individuals have helped keep the *Camp Springs News* vibrant and 50 issues is something to celebrate! Residents such as Mike Enzweiler and Anna Zinkhon have often contributed news items and updates of interest to the community. And there have always been volunteers willing to print and distribute the issues, as. The current team includes Bob Johnson, Sharon Ramler and Natalie Ryan. As the editor, I want to thank everyone who has contributed to this publication since August 2008. I also want to encourage everyone in the community to submit newsworthy items or sponsorships to me for publication, so we can keep the *Camp Springs News* going for many more issues.

Bread of Life Food Pantry Remains Open During Pandemic

Even during the pandemic, the Bread of Life Food Pantry continues serving residents of Campbell County from St. John Lutheran at 5977 Lower Tug Fork Road. The Food Pantry is open on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of each month from 1-3 p.m. and has adopted a curbside distribution model to keep volunteers and clients safe.

Clients who meet USDA income requirements, which are available at <http://www.nkadd.org/individuals/housing-food/commodities-program>, have access to USDA-provided food-stuffs once a month. Bread of Life also provides a bag of additional items such as laundry detergent and paper products that have been donated to the pantry or purchased from monetary donations. Please stop by if you are eligible to receive these benefits, and spread the word to others who are eligible.
