Winery Focus: Camp Springs Vineyard

The Camp Springs Vineyard is a family owned and operated vineyard and winery located among the rolling hills and stone houses of Four Mile Road in historic Camp Springs. The first floor houses the actual winery, the second floor (with the main entrance around the second bend) is the tasting room and store, and the third floor is an open loft which is available for rental. Guests can enjoy white, red and fruit wines in the air-conditioned tasting room or on the porch.

The tasting room interior is decorated with antiques such as a 1910 player piano, a 1904 Davis sewing machine (both in working condition), and many other historic items. Home-made quilts and other local art and crafts are also displayed for sale.

If you've never visited this winery, consider spending a few hours this spring enjoying fine wine and the hospitality of the Linus Enzweiler family at the Camp Springs Vineyard at 6685 Four Mile Road. For further information, see ad on page two.
