Camp Springs Comes Alive 7th Annual Herbst Tour

Usually a quiet, rural community, Camp Springs will become a tourist destination on Sunday, October 20, from noon to 6 p.m. The Herbst Tour, now in its seventh year, is a self-guided auto tour which features attractions such as horse and working farms, gardens, stone houses, churches, vineyards and wineries.

Three of this year's nineteen stops are new: the Uebel stone house, the Vogel house and farm outside of Silver Grove and the new St. Anne Woodlands Preserve.

In addition to the stone house at the Uebel stop, there is a completely renovated barn on the property. The Vogel family grows watermelons, pumpkins and flowers on their farm. Chickens, ducks, flowers and pick-your-own pumpkins (weather conditions permitting) will be available on tour day. An original 1800's covered wagon will be on site along with bee-keeping demonstrations and beeswax candle dipping. Homemade jams and jellies made with honey will also be for sale.

The fifty acres of the St. Anne Woodlands comprise the last old growth forest in Campbell County, and contain beech, poplar and pin oaks among other species. A view of the St. Anne Convent alone is well worth the stop.

The features of the other sixteen stops continue to evolve from year to year. Regardless of whether you have visited a stop before, you will surely see something new and exciting this year.

Food, refreshments and restrooms are available at many tour stops. Admission is free. A map will be available at the Camp Springs Firehouse, 6844 Four Mile Road (Exit Rt. 547) off the AA Highway.
