## Campbell County Historical Society News

The 2nd printing of our newest publication, *One Day In Campbell County* has arrived and is available for sale. This was such a fun project to produce. In the early part of 2019, we posted notices for photographers, amateur and professional, to participate in a book project. Sixty photographers responded and spent the entire day on Saturday, April 27, 2019, taking pictures of every inch of our County. They submitted over 1,900 photographs and we compiled them into this book.

The finished product is a full color, 260 page, hardcover book printed on high quality photo paper. This is a book you will want to share with others and pass down from generation to generation. It makes a great Father's Day gift. Books are \$35 each (cash or check) and you can get your copy at Pelle's Café in Silver Grove, 27 Strands in Alexandria, or at the Campbell County Historical Society Office in Alexandria.

The Historical Society is resuming regular meetings on June 10 at 7 p.m., when we will gather at the Peace Bell in Newport.

Our campaign to raise funding for a new location continues. We are working with the City of Silver Grove and Southbank Partners to build a museum and library that are convenient and accessible to everyone in the county, and that will become a point of interest on Riverfront Commons, the walking, running, biking path that Southbank Partners is creating from Ludlow to Penderly Park.
