

Ash Street Forced Main  
Sanitation District One Project  
Outline to Date January 2014

- July 2010 Property Owners receive letters requesting access to property for surveying.  
Anna Zinkhon called to get more info on request. In this phone conversation Anna learns about a raw sewer pipeline being designed for the area. She requests and organizes a community meeting for property owners to learn more from SD1.
- August 2010 Community Meeting of property owners and concerned citizens of Camp Springs. First time any public meeting is held regarding this project. Representatives from SD1, Cardinal Engineering, Viox Services and GRW Engineers presented tentative design drawings on this project. Assuring citizens that these are just preliminary.  
  
At this meeting all vendors committed to researching our concerns and bringing back design changes/recommendation.
- Nov.2010 Property owners receive Easement request letters for our property and proposed route through community.  
  
Anna Zinkhon called all vendors from August meeting to find out when we would learn about the design changes or answers to citizens concerns as promised in August meeting. Each said they would get back to me, but did not. Finally , Kyle Boyles, a member of SD1 staff, called Ms. Zinkhon and asked why she was bothering everyone for a meeting? What did she want with another meeting? Ms. Zinkhon explained that the vendors committed to the community to come back with design changes/answers and she wanted to schedule the meeting.  
  
Mr. Boyles stated that they had acquired some easement signatures and they did not see a need for another meeting. End of subject.
- Dec.2010 Zinkhon schedules community meeting to update property owners and give Mr. Boyles' message to all. Community is very upset. We have been lied to and some residents signed easements because they were scarred senior citizens.
- Jan. 2011 - Records requests and hours of scanning through SD1 files to learn more about this project and processes. Learn that Federal funds being pursued and learn about Section 106 requirements.
- May 2011

- August- Acquire and review of Historical and Archaeological survey. Discover this review is incomplete and review was never done of Camp Springs structures. Write letters to Kentucky Heritage Council alerting them and pleading for help. Letters to State Representatives Stine and Fischer, letters to Governor Beshear.
- September As a result of letter to Gov.Beshear, we were contacted by Ky Division of Water.
- Nov.-Dec Kentucky Heritage Council reviewing our concerns
- Jan.2012 Citizens group hosts a meeting with Kentucky Division of Water, Kentucky Heritage Council and SD1. Meeting is a sharing of citizens concerns of pipeline impact to our farms, agricultural tourism and historical significance. A tour of community is given to guests to highlight community and history. Tour also shows construction problems from SD1 past projects and environmental problems that have been ongoing for five years.
- Citizens do not trust SD1 and their work. This is a result of lack of transparency on project, lack of community involvement and misleading residences, no follow through on commitments.
- Feb/March New (2<sup>nd</sup>) historical and archaeological survey required by Kentucky Heritage Council is started in Camp Springs and Silver Grove.
- May 2012 Receive copy of new survey. Document is much larger and actually reviews all properties in detail. Excellent job!

### 2013

- February Group of citizens attend SD1 Board Monthly board meeting. We inform them of our issues and inform them we intend to fight this project through Appeals Court.
- Board members act surprised since the month prior they were informed that this project was moving along with no property owner resistance! They ask why we have just now come to them with our problems when project is 2 years old. We explained that we have never supported this project and we have been working with SD1 staff and management, we assumed board was informed of our issues.
- Board plans to investigate.

March	Attend board meeting for updates. No news
April	Attend board meeting. Citizen (Mr.Plattner) finds a tree expert snooping around yard and bushes. Mr.Plattner approaches and inquires. Matthew Franc was hired by SD1 to document age and investigate trees associated with historical properties. Want his educated opinion on construction effects of pipeline on trees. No one let us know that this person was coming.
May-August	Attend board meetings.  Tree report is complete. Even though hundreds of trees will be destroyed, only the ones on National Historic Landmark properties are of concern to SD1 because of historical review requirements. Indiana bat habitat is effected but by taking down trees in Jan/Feb they by-pass this issue. Endangered species are endangered by loss of habitat too!!!
September	SD1 staff gives project overview on Ash Street Forced Main, we are notified and invited!
October	Kentucky Division of Water hosts the first and only Public Hearing on this project. Alexandria Court House, October 15. SD1 presents new design documents for this project. First time since 2011 that designs documents have been available with so called changes and requests from property owners. We request a set at the meeting. It was denied. Must go through Public records request procedure to obtain. Any comments on these designs are required to be in to Ky Division of Water by October 30. It takes 3-4 days to get designs through records request act. We file extension for the Public Review Period. No Response or acknowledgement from our request from KDOV.  Letters written to Governor Office. Being investigated.
December	Waiting for KDOW – SPEAR , no updates
2014	
January	Still waiting for SPEAR – this will be info on the observations of the Ky Division of Water about this project and it’s route. Once SPEAR is released, public comment will be accepted on it’s content for 30 days. We await.
