

CHAPTER ELEVEN

Before I proceed further I would like to go back to Chapter Seven where I introduced Peter Steffen's brother Johann Steffen 1771-1826. I stated that I had unknown cousins in America. Although they are not direct descendents of Peter Steffen 1782, they are the families of Peter's brother and therefore cousins.

I stated there were four sons who came to America when actually there was a fifth son, Peter who was the first to arrive in 1837. This Peter and his wife Mary may well have been the Peter and Mary who bought the farm in Four Mile for Peter 1782 before he arrived in Kentucky. If you are confused by soo many Peter Steffens, wait till we get to the Enzweiler family.

At the risk of repeating myself, I want to go back to Chapter Seven and add this new found information.

Since Peter was living in Dayton Ohio in 1841 would he likely have bought the farm in Four Mile for Peter Steffen 1782?

Peter 1798 and his family were the first to arrive in America although the Losheim book does not record when he left Germany. He came to America on the ship Chevalier from Havre, arriving in Baltimore August 4, 1837.

Many of the Kenton County KY. Steffen families are descendents of Johann's family.

What was the cause of death and on the same day?
The record is not clear where their children lived or died here in America.

As I have stated in other writings, I wonder about the method of communication in 1840 and 1860. Do I assume the mail to be more primitive than it was? Families seemed to find siblings here and direct siblings in Germany as to the opportunities available to them for employment in America.

The **fifth** child of Johann **Steffen** 1771 did not leave Germany until October 3, 1860.
