Sewer Main Meeting Held

On February 23, about 50 concerned citizens of Camp Springs met at the firehouse to discuss the proposed Forced Main Sewer Line. The meeting was planned by Anna Zinkhon and Elissa Plattner, as was the meeting in August 2010.

Camp Springs is not a city, and it appears as if Sanitation District 1 assumes that going through Camp Springs is the easiest path for this forced main. Sewage from Silver Grove and other cities needs to be pumped to the new processing plant in Alexandria. There are no benefits for residents of Camp Springs, but the impact will be felt by all who live or travel along Four Mile Road. Camp Springs does not have a city attorney, mayor or city council to speak on behalf of the citizens and negotiate for their benefit. "But we are still a community and we can stand together and protect our property and our rights," said Anna Zinkhon in opening comments. At the meeting SD1 had representatives available to answer questions and they left design maps of the project at the firehouse. Anyone interested in learning about the route should stop at the firehouse and take a look at these documents.

"We should have been included in this decision or at least made aware, long before now," commented Myron Born. The new pump station near the AA Highway was completed a couple of years ago, indicating that the plan for this line was decided many years ago. Whitey Heeb is concerned about the smells that will come from the vents. "Once the smell is in this valley it will hang for a long time. We won't be able to stand to come outside especially in the summer." He already experiences smells from the pump station since his property adjoins it near the AA Highway. Sanitation District assured everyone that there will not be any smell because of the planned filters. But many people are concerned and don't trust verbal commitments. CSI sent a letter to the Sanitation District in November about this project, in an attempt to establish lines of communication, but no acknowledgement of this letter was made by SD1.

Zinkhon and Plattner plan to gather concerns from citizens at the next meeting and submit a document to SD1 listing Camp Springs requirements. "We want everyone to think about their individual situation and then we need to compile a list for the community," says Zinkhon. "We will speak as one and have a larger voice."


