Preserve and Protect Camp Springs

At the November meeting of Preserve and Protect Camp Springs, information was shared on two topics. First, the lawsuits and lawyer fees pertaining to the proposed sewer line were discussed. There are two lawsuits pending, one of which centers on environmental issues. The proposed sewer line would cross some areas that have been landfills or the sites of chemical spills. As of press time, SD1 has not yet put the proposed sewer project out for bids. Members of Preserve and Protect have been going door to door in Camp Springs to make sure that landowners are aware of the projected sewer line and its ramifications.

Residents can help in this cause by considering an end-ofthe year donation to Preserve and Protect. All donations go directly to offset lawyers' fees. There are no administrative costs.

The second topic discussed was the rehabilitation of the Four-Mile Creek watershed. Preserve and Protect plans to hold public meetings on the subject with partners ranging from the County Extension Service to NKU and to the Kentucky Division of Water. A survey for all residents is planned and will be sent out at a future date. There is grant money from sources such as the Kentucky Division of Fish and Wildlife for projects to clean up the creek and its watershed.

Anna Zinkhon announced at the meeting that she is running for Judge Executive of Campbell County. The primary will be on May 22. Come out and vote!

Campbell County Animal Shelter

The Campbell County Animal Shelter is located in Camp Springs at the corner or Poplar Ridge Road and Four Mile Road. The shelter provides pet adoption services for the entire county, but has a special program designed for the county's rural residents.

The Barn Cat Program is designed to place cats with owners who need and outdoor cat for rodent control. Another benefit of the program is that it lowers the shelter's euthanasia rate, since more cats can be placed. The Barn Cat Program provides cats that have been spayed or neutered, tested for feline leukemia and FIV, wormed and vaccinated. For information on the Barn Cat Program, please call 859-635-2819.
