Dining Out in Camp Springs

Stonebrook Winery, 6570 Vineyard Lane, offers dinners by reservation only and Hamburger Fridays from 5-8 p.m., which are open to walk-ins. *Reservations can be made by calling (859-635-0111).*

Spring dinner dates for 2018 are March 10, March 24, April 14, April 21, May 5 and May 19. The dinner menu consists of BBQ-grilled baby back ribs, grilled pork tenderloin, grilled chicken or apple wood smoked salmon; salad, new red potatoes, country green beans, homemade bread, and an assortment of dessert offerings. Dinners are \$25.00 person. Coffee and tea are included in the price, but wine is separate. There is also live music for the dinners, which have one seating from 6-10 p.m.

Hamburger Fridays will be held from May 17, 2018 until November 1, 2018. Local beef burgers from the Campbell County Beef Association are used. They are hormone and antibiotic free and are from locally raised beef. Burgers are served with potato chips, grilled onions, dill pickle, tomato and lettuce on a toasted bun from a local bakery.

All dining is in the renovated 1890 farm house tasting room. When weather permits, diners sit outside on the pavilion, where they can enjoy the flower gardens, fountains and scenic valley views.

Private events for 20 individuals or more can be scheduled upon request. The menu ranges from soup and sandwich to a full dinner.

Camp Springs Tavern features food trucks seasonally, such as Four Mile Pig, Cheese N Chong and Yum Dogz. Customers are also encouraged to carry in food or have pizza delivered.

Little Rock Farm is going to "round down" and celebrate Pi Day a little early this year: on March 11th. All guests will get a taste of the Mystery Pie along with a sampling of two other pie flavors. The choices will be Butterscotch Pie, Blackberry Pie, Lemon Meringue Pie, Magic Cookie Bar Pie and Sour Orange Pie. Gluten Free options will be available. \$7 covers pie and a drink. Come on down to the farmhouse!

On April 22, Zucchini Bread Day, Little Rock will host a dessert event featuring different flavors of zucchini bread from 2 – 6 p.m. Breakfast at the Farmhouse is on May 20 from 9-11 a.m. and includes a slice of quiche and a sweet (i.e. coffee cake, cinnamon roll, zucchini bread, scone). *Contact lrf@campsprings.com to make reservations for all events.*

Information Flows at Watershed Event

On January 25th, the Campbell County Extension Office hosted a meeting with the theme of watershed protection at its Highland Heights location. Speakers from the Kentucky Division of Water, the Campbell County Conservation District, NKU and the Extension Office spoke to a crowd about best management practices, grant opportunities and ideas for incorporating sustainability into agricultural and backyard areas.

Danielle Rogers introduced the audience to the concept of BMPs, or best management practices. Farms that have a BMP plan on file can be eligible for cost-share funding of some improvement projects. She also mentioned that non-point source pollution, which includes run-off from farms and from parking lots and roadways, is the primary contributor to water pollution in Kentucky.

Amy Winkler gave examples of cost-share funding available from the Conservation District for dead animal removal, farm dump clean-up and backyard conservation. Both technical and financial assistance for these projects are available. Backyard conservation can include projects such as rain barrels and raised garden beds.

Scott Fennell, from NKU's environmental science program, showed examples of stream and wetland restoration initiatives in northern Kentucky. He also gave examples of mitigation projects undertaken by farmers and developers.

DJ Scully from the Campbell County Extension Office spoke about the importance of stream buffers. Interested property owners can contact him for consultation on proposed improvements.

The evening provided an informative kick-off for plans to clean up and restore the Four Mile Creek valley.
