## Camp Springs Churches Welcome New Clergy

St. Joseph Catholic Church and St. John Lutheran Church welcomed new clergy this summer. Rev. Adam Forbes will be installed at St. John this fall, and Fr. Ryan Stenger has been serving as the parish priest at St. Joseph since early June.

Pastor Adam was born in West Virginia but lived in Ohio since the age of five. A youth leader at his church was influential in his interest in entering the public ministry. He graduated from Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus in 2007 and spent seven years working in community social work before his ordination in 2014. Pastor Adam served St. John as an interim pastor from October 2017 till August 2018. He currently lives in Fort Thomas with his wife and two children.

As the congregation continues its mission beyond its 157 years of existence, Pastor Adam is looking forward to his role as pastor of St. John. He is particularly interested in looking for needs in our community that St. John can help fill.

Pastor Adam will be installed at St. John Lutheran on Sunday, October 21 at 3 p.m. The community is invited to attend the installation and the open house that will follow.

Fr. Stenger is from Florence, Kentucky. He studied at the University of Louisville, in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, and then spent three years studying at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. His focus was on canon law. Fr. Stenger served the Covington Diocese at various parishes and in administration until he was named St Joseph's parish priest. He continues to work at the diocesan offices and is chaplain of his alma mater, Covington Latin High School. He says mass regularly at The Seasons of Alexandria.

Administering the Sacraments and visiting the homebound are primary to Fr. Stenger's ministry. He is also excited about the expanding pre-school program at St. Joseph and is looking for ways to support Catholic education for the parish's families.
