## News from Fire District #1

Wayne Wermann was hired as the Fire Chief for Campbell County Fire District #1 in February 2019. He is a lifelong resident of Campbell County who graduated from Campbell County High School. He and his wife Lisa have two daughters and three grandchildren. They currently live in the city of Crestview and are members of St. John Lutheran Church.

Campbell County Fire District #1 is the largest fire department by area in Campbell County. The fire district is a combination department which means it is staffed by both paid and volunteer personnel. The district is serviced by three stations. The department provides ALS ambulance service with two ambulances. The district has four pumpers, one water tanker, three brush/pickups and a chief's vehicle. Each and every day there are four paid personnel on duty in the district.

Since the consolidation of Fire District #1 there have been many rumors about the Camp Springs fire station. The building is not for sale and it is still being used. The fire department's administrative offices, including the Fire Chief's office are at the Camp Springs station and there are still fire apparatus in the building. The fire district holds its monthly meetings there and Fire/EMS training classes and other activities are still held at the Camp Springs station. The station is still the polling place for elections.

Looking to the future, the fire district maintains a visionary committee to look and see what the organization can do to look ahead. One example is that the fire district is looking to purchasing some land for future endeavors. The reason for this is that land is cheaper now than it will be in five, ten, or twenty years. Everyone knows land is getting scarce and much more expensive in our area.

Our Fire Chief would like to invite everyone to attend the fire district meetings, which are held monthly on the third Thursday at the Camp Springs fire station at 7 p.m.

If you would like to volunteer or have ever thought about volunteering as a firefighter or medical technician, the fire district is always taking applications.
