Anna Zinhon Reports on CCFD1

I regret to inform everyone that my term on Campbell County Fire District One has ended. Two four-year terms taught me so much about the cost, challenges and the people needed to provide emergency services to our fire district! And so many people do not know that the volunteer fire departments decided to merge into one district back in 2002. This district was formed because not enough people can find the time to volunteer as a firemen/EMT's. So paid firemen were needed, and the volunteer organizations saw the importance of merging so their funds could work together! The volunteer organizations maintain their clubs and host social events - ham shoot, fish fry, turkey shoot to raise money. Some of this money is used to maintain the fire houses. For more information on these organizations, please contact their chairpersons.

CCFD1 does provide excellent service to its residents. The tax dollars you pay for fire/EMT are spent very carefully! Many people don't realize that fire/EMT services have a capped funding system. This means that the tax percentage remains fixed. CCFD1 has been at this capped total for many years. Unlike libraries in Kentucky which can request an increase in tax percentage, fire districts cannot. The only way CCFD1 can get more money per year to cover the cost of equipment, payroll, etc. is when new houses are built, or a new industry moves into our district. CCFD1 is the second largest district in Campbell County, after Southern Campbell. The budget for CCFD1 is about \$1.3 million. For comparison, Alexandria Fire District has a budget of about \$2 million and Central Campbell about \$3 million.

We are also contracted by Melbourne VFD to provide ambulance service for Melbourne's fire district. I hope that someday, MVFD will join our district so that we can pool our money to help pay for 24/7 fire and ambulance service. Our district has an area of about 40 square miles, and it is shaped like a long rectangle. Therefore, we put a lot of miles on our expensive equipment; ambulances cost about \$200,000 each. I highly recommend attendance at fire district meetings. The CCFD1 meeting is held the third Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. at the Camp Springs Fire House.

Sewer Line Update

We are happy to report that the sewer project through Camp Springs has been stopped. The current project design includes two large tanks to contain storm water overflow. One is at the bottom of Industrial Rd. and the other at the end of Blangey Rd. Anna Zinkhon would like to extend her thanks to "all of the property owners that stuck together as an awesome community to protect Camp Springs."
