Camp Springs Church Responds to EKY Flooding

Individuals and the congregation of St. John Lutheran on Lower Tug Fork Road have longstanding connections to Eastern Kentucky. Because of this, the response to the devastation caused by recent flooding in the eastern part of the state was swift and generous. Here's how the effort all came together.

July 30: donations from the congregations of St. John and St. Luke Lutheran (Cold Spring) were solicited.

July 31: The trailer at St. John and another trailer at St. Luke were ready to receive donated items. A request for donations also went out on Facebook.

August 2: The congregation's contact in EKY mentioned the need for large water tanks. Three water tanks were donated—two by a local business and one by someone on Facebook who had planned to sell the tank, but donated it when he heard where it was going. Items that had been collected for the tornado victims, but were still in storage, were donated by CCFD1. State Representative Rachel Roberts, who happened to be at the fire station at the time, came out to the church to see the trailers and trucks being loaded.

August 3: The two trailers were taken to Beattyville, Kentucky. From there the items were distributed to the affected counties.

August 4: Modern Lutheran Women from St. John Lutheran took further requested items, including first aid kits and mosquito repellent to Beattyville.

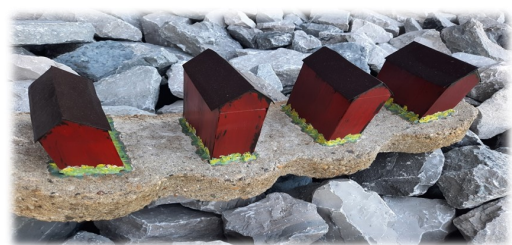
August 16: Additional donated funds were used to purchase first aid kits that were delivered along with other flood relief items.

As of press time, cash donations totaling over \$3,900 have been made towards flood relief. There were also many donations of goods made by community members and the members of St. Luke Lutheran and Gloria Dei Lutheran in Crestview Hills. The organizers at St. John were amazed at the generosity of our community.
